## **UK Policy**



- To work towards a world free of nuclear weapons
- Part of our commitment to the nuclear nonproliferation treaty
- To have a viable disarmament treaty it is essential it can be verified
- Work on verification now builds momentum, ensures UK voice in negotiations

#### What is verification?



- Inspection
- Monitoring & Technology
- Confidence building
- Compliance



 Without appropriate technologies and understanding of the science of verification none of this will be possible

  - >25 States, including academic involvement






- How do you know an item is a nuclear weapon?
- How do you keep chain of custody of weapons and monitoring equipment in secure facilities?
- How do you trust equipment supplied by another party?
- How do you trust data generated by nontrusted equipment and/or transferred through insecure networks?

### **Nuclear measurements**



- Challenging due to circumstances
- Compliance with Non-proliferation, security and safety obligations
- Inspectors cannot know the design details of the nuclear weapon they are inspecting
- Confirm it is a weapon through indicative measurements
  - Contains relevant nuclear and explosive material of the right grade in a substantive quantity
  - Without revealing exact figures or details
  - Yes/No answers behind an information barrier







- New and novel approaches are required
- Requires innovative ways of using simple, and therefore trustable, technologies
- UK has a wealth of knowledge and experience in the individual techniques just not applied to arms control and disarmament
- Looking to build a UK community that can contribute to an issue of national and international importance
